NSPIRE Inspections



Attention residents! Our Elmwood, Little Washington, Woodcrest, Lincoln, and Walnut will soon undergo an inspection under the new National Standards for the Physical Inspection of Real Estate (NSPIRE) protocol. This new HUD initiative is designed to ensure the highest standards of safety, health, and habitability for all residents. Here's what you need to know to prepare for the upcoming inspection.

What is NSPIRE? NSPIRE replaces the previous inspection standards with a more resident-focused approach. It emphasizes critical health and safety concerns, ensuring that properties meet strict federal guidelines. The goal is to create a safer and more livable environment for all tenants.

When Will the Inspection Occur? The official inspection date will be announced soon, but we advise residents to begin preparations now. Inspections may include both common areas and individual units. We get a 14 day advance notice of the inspection and will let you know as soon as we do. We will not not know which units will be chosen by the inspection ahead of time.

What Areas Will Be Inspected? Inspectors will focus on:

- Smoke detectors and fire safety measures
- Plumbing and electrical systems
- Heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) functionality
- Structural integrity, including walls, ceilings, and flooring
- Pest control and sanitation
- Overall unit and property maintenance

How to Prepare: Residents can take the following steps to ensure compliance:

- Ensure all smoke detectors are operational.
- Report any plumbing or electrical issues to management immediately.
- Keep living spaces clean and free from hazards.
- Notify property management of any necessary repairs or maintenance.

What to Expect During the Inspection: A HUD-certified inspector will conduct a thorough walkthrough of the property. If any issues are identified, they will be documented, and management will address them promptly. Residents are not required to be present during the inspection.

How does the NSPIRE Score impact the HACG?: The NSPIRE inspection score directly affects the Public Housing Authority by influencing funding, compliance status, and overall reputation. A higher score demonstrates that the property meets HUD's safety and habitability standards, ensuring continued funding and operational support.

CNI Update

The Choice Neighborhoods Initiative (CNI) is a collaborative effort between the Housing Authority and the City of Goldsboro to secure a \$50 million HUD grant to revitalize West Haven and develop the new West Oak neighborhood. The plan includes rebuilding public housing, improving surrounding areas, and creating opportunities for residents through partnerships with local organizations, schools, and businesses.

A key early project is a new pocket park near the bus depot, featuring walking paths, water elements, and play areas for residents and the broader community.

To keep residents engaged, the CNI team has hosted events such as senior hangouts, neighborhood watch meetings, Bible studies, holiday safety sessions, and health and wellness workshops. A new partnership with the Goldsboro YMCA has connected West Haven teens to the Teen Achievers program, which provides college visits, career skills training, and enrichment activities.

Alongside its own initiatives, the CNI team supports broader Housing Authority programs, including the Fall Festival, senior meals, and youth activities. Work continues on refining the redevelopment plan with input from HUD, city officials, and project managers.



Through hard work, dedication, and the support of our Family Self-Sufficiency Program, she built her clientele and recently secured shelf space for her products at JC Beauty Supply in Goldsboro. We were proud to recognize her achievements with an Achievement Award at our Women's Empowerment Event. Keep up the great work!



As we approach the final six months of the Jobs Plus program, we are pleased to share the significant advancements we have made in supporting our residents. Although the program is concluding six months earlier than initially planned, our commitment to providing essential services—including rent incentives, daycare assistance, transportation services, and educational opportunities—remains steadfast for those residents who have actively engaged with the program. With the program's end date set for June 30, 2025, we continue to prioritize the needs of our participants who are dedicated to their personal and professional development.

Jobs Plus Program Update

Currently, 221 individuals remain enrolled in the Jobs Plus program. The following services have been made available to participants:

Daycare Assistance: Full and part-time daycare support has been provided to 25 participants, enabling them to pursue employment and educational opportunities.

Transportation Assistance:

We have offered transportation support, including gas cards, bus passes, and third-party transportation services, to 68 participants, facilitating their access to job opportunities and educational institutions.

Job Search Assistance: A total of 83 participants have received assistance in their job search efforts, equipping them with the tools and resources necessary to secure employment.

Educational Support: We have supported 35 participants in their pursuit of further education through technical training, certificate programs, and degree attainment (both bachelor's and associate degrees).

Financial Management

Services: Our program has assisted 77 participants in developing financial literacy skills, including budget creation, bank account establishment, credit report reviews, and effective money management strategies.

Rent Incentives: 106 participants have been enrolled in the Jobs Plus rent incentive program (rent was not increased due to employment income), 42 participants saved on rent, with a total rent savings to date of \$242.475.00.

The Jobs Plus team takes immense pride in the accomplishments of our residents, whether they involve securing employment, completing certificate programs, or developing comprehensive financial plans. These achievements reflect the hard work, dedication, and commitment of our participants to achieving self-sufficiency and improving their quality of life.

As we move forward in the final months of the Jobs Plus program, we remain dedicated to supporting our residents in their journeys toward personal and professional success. The progress made thus far is a testament to the resilience and determination of our participants, and we look forward to celebrating their continued achievements.



Jobs Plus Journeys!

Nate has been an active participant in the Jobs Plus program since 2022. Throughout his enrollment, he has consistently engaged with the various resources offered by the program, including job search assistance, transportation support, and educational guidance. As a result of these efforts, Nate secured employment with Habitat for Humanity's Restore in July 2024. In addition to his professional endeavors, he is currently pursuing a degree in Mechanical Engineering at Wayne Community College. Nate's commitment to helping others and serving as a positive role model within his community distinguishes him as an exemplary young man. The Jobs Plus program takes pride in his achievements and extends its best wishes for his continued success in the future.





Malaysia has been enrolled in the Jobs Plus program since February 2024, during which she has benefited significantly from the program's support, particularly in the areas of educational and transportation and assistance. In July 2024, she enrolled in the Phlebotomy Program at Wayne Community College, successfully completing her coursework in November 2024. Following her program completion, Malaysia passed her state certification exam and has updated her resume accordingly. She is now well-positioned to pursue a full-time career as a phlebotomist. The Jobs Plus program is immensely proud of Malaysia's dedication to achieving self-sufficiency and her commitment to her professional development.

Aging in Place

The Housing Authority of the City of Goldsboro continues to be committed to helping older residents age in place by providing services and resources to assist them in different aspects of life.



Senior Pantries

Pantries are available at each management office with supplies for seniors 62 and older who need toilet paper, adult diapers, soap, dish detergent, and laundry soap.

These pantries should be used as needed, not as a monthly resource. Senior residents who have a need can contact the property managers on Wednesday mornings between 10 am and 11:30 am for assistance!

HACG is set to introduce a range of wellness resources and health-related information, covering topics such as diabetes, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, smoking cessation, and COPD. While open to everyone, these sessions will primarily target seniors, aiming to equip them with educational resources to prevent and manage chronic health conditions effectively.
