

Hot fudge Cake

Serves 8

- •1 3/4 cups brown sugar
- •1 cup flour (heathier option try whole wheat flour)
- •3 tbsp + 1/4 cup unsweetend cocoa
- •1 1/2 tsp baking powder
- •1/2 tsp salt
- •1/2 cup skim milk
- •2 tbsp butter, melted (healthier option I Can't Believe It's Not Butter spray butter)
- •1/2 tsp vanilla
- •1 3/4 cups boiling water

Make It

- 1. In bowl, mix together 1 cup brown sugar, flour, 3 tbsp cocoa, baking powder, and salt)
- 2. Stir in milk, butter, and vanilla
- 3. Pour into slow cooker sprayed with nonfat cooking spray
- 4. In seperate bowl, mix 3/4 cup brown sugar and 1/4 cup cocoa. Sprinkle over batter in slower cooker. DO NOT stir
- 5. Pour boiling water over mixture. DO NOT stir
- 6. Cover. Cook on high 1 1/2-1 3/4 hours, or until insert toothpick and comes out clean
