HACG Scholarships Awarded to Seniors Pursuing Postsecondary Education

The Housing Authority of the City of Goldsboro (HACG), will award four (4) outstanding seniors from multiple housing developments in the City, academic scholarships towards pursuing a postsecondary education after their high school graduation. Our HACG Scholars this fall will attend Wayne Community College, Johnson & Wales University, East Carolina University, and the University of North Carolina at Charlotte.

The scholarship winners were notified on May 1st and will be awarded between \$1000 and \$3000 in funding each for the 2018-2019 school year to cover costs including tuition, fees, room and board, books and \$500 in essential supplies handpicked by the awardees and HACG staff. Open to all eligible HACG residents, the recipients were selected based on their academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, statement of goals and aspirations, and unusual personal or family circumstances.

HACG Scholar Program was established in 2017 to significantly increase the number of public housing students that are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. "I get to see first-hand the challenges some of our residents face living in public housing and these ladies desire to pursue higher education will not only improve their lives but the life of their entire family." – Sharita Oates ROSS Coordinator.

"This being our 1st scholarship award year, we're excited to be able to offer monetary support to these students that have worked hard and will further their education. We hope this scholarship will give our awardees a boost for the next stage in their educational journey. We plan to keep track of their progress and offer additional support if needed. In addition, HACG hopes to expand our Scholar Program to offer adult residents continuing their education monetary support, in addition to that already available through our Jobs Plus and ROSS self-sufficiency programs." – CEO Anthony Goodson, Jr.

HACG is very proud of all the scholarship recipients and wishes them the best in their future success!

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

WHAT ARE DENTAL SEALANTS?

As a molar grows, pits and grooves form on the top of the toolt. These grooves can trap food and hacteria and cause decay. A dental sealant fills the grooves. This keeps food out and makes it easier to keep the tooth clean.

DOES IT HURT?

No, getting a scalant is nainless. It only takes about 5 minutes per tooth. No drilling or shols are necessary. Nernal dally routines and meals can resume immediately after scalants are applied. There is no recovery time, or soreness.

WHO SHOULD GET SEALNTS?

Children should be checked by a dentist to lind out if sealants might prevent decay. The best time to check would be just after the six year molars appear. Teeth should be checked again just after the tweive-year molars appear. These molars are permanent teeth and will not grow back if they are loss to decay.
